- A local Governing Board of Directors provides oversight. The Board is comprised of volunteers from industry, small business and community at large. There are 18 member volunteers that serve on the Board of Directors
- The Community Campaign supports local programs providing vital services through the Community Investment Grant process
 - The Community Grant process is a competitive grant process with a very strict & comprehensive criteria based on *Governance, Audited Financial Review, Outcome Measurements and Community Needs*
- The United Way MSJC also has 7 Community Initiatives
- The Community & Workforce Campaign raises the funds to invest in local programs that impact individuals and families during every stage of life.

Do You Know ALICE?





ALICE is a database that uses local information from throughout the state of Texas to define current income levels by family size for poverty, survival, and financial stability within the community. ALICE helps to identify those in the community that under-employed and struggling but often do not qualify for programs requiring federal poverty requirements. ALICE is a realistic review of the community's financial stability.





Provides 1 week of intense residential substance abuse recovery




Provides 4 youth with scouting programs for a full year to help them prepare for life
