

Addressing Food Insecurities through multiple channels



The Garden began with the idea of providing an environment for local residents of West Port Arthur to work, nourish and harvest food for their tables from adopted Garden Raised Beds. There are 19 adopted beds that residents and organizations are utilizing for that purpose. Those beds are managed by the West Port Arthur Community Garden Board.

The United Way has 16 designated beds that they will utilize to support families through programs serving West Port Arthur residents to address food insecurities.

The final avenue of distribution is community focused with distribution at time announced for seniors citizens and families during the weeks of harvest from the United Way designated garden plots.
